COMMUNITY:

Badger High School is located in the southeast corner of Wisconsin in Walworth County. This is an area rich in diversity. The combination of a traditional agricultural heritage with the cosmopolitan flavor of a major resort area, a growing industrial base and the influx of professionals from larger metropolitan areas has created a population with a broad range of ethnic, economic and social backgrounds.

SCHOOL:

Badger High School includes grades 9 through 12 and is one of the few remaining union high schools in Wisconsin. It serves students from four public and three private elementary schools. The program of studies features a wide range of academic electives.

ACCREDITATION:

Badger High School is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges.

ENROLLMENT:

1,343 students, grades 9 through 12.

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION:

Forty-seven percent (47%) of the graduates from the class of 2020 planned to continue their education at a college or university. Twenty-six percent (26%) planned to continue their education at vocational/technical schools.

CLASS RANK:

Badger High School uses a Laude Point System. Cum Laude with Honor and Distinction (17-31.99 points), Magna Cum Laude with Great Honor and Distinction (32-44.99 points), Summa Cum Laude with Highest Honor and Distinction (45 or more points).

GPA:

- GPA is based on ALL completed courses with ALL designated Honor and AP courses being weighted
- GPA will be calculated to the nearest hundredth
- Term GPA will be calculated at the completion of each quarter and semester

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

A diploma is awarded to students who earn at least 24 credits including the following required courses:
